## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



I am writing this message on Bright Monday. Yesterday we celebrated Pascha. Our beautiful church resounded with the cries of Christos Anesti and Alithos Anesti. Christ Is Risen, Truly He Is Risen. The promise of salvation is laid before each of us. Do we appreciate the love, the agape, that we are offered? I hope we do. Do we shed any tears on Good Friday? I hope we do. Do we become better Christians after the Great Fast? I hope we do. On Holy Tuesday we sing the Hymn of the Bridegroom. Will we be ready? I hope we will.

Saint John Chrysostom welcomed all, even those who fasted only at the eleventh hour and those who did not fast at all. Come with the fear of God, faith and love and partake of the feast, For the devil is Vexed, Christ has trampled down death by death. Rejoice in the day and be glad in it.

Be glad, also, that we are having a regular festival this year. Many of us are working to ensure that we are prepared. We are confident that we are going to be ready. Supplies are ordered and support functions will be in place, We hope that our loyal customers come back to enjoy our Greek culture and cuisine.

Nevertheless, you all know that to have a successful Festival we need volunteers. And we need new faces, young backs and legs to prepare and then to show up to work during the festival itself. The Festival preparation schedule has been published and I ask you to consider devoting as much time as you can to the various jobs. We do provide on the job training. Don't be shy. Your time and talent will be greatly appreciated.

Time, talent, and treasure- the three pillars that support every not for profit organization. A successful not for profit has these elements in abundance. Seeing the strength of our balance sheet, a parishioner told me that our church, compared to many others, is financially strong. Other churches would love to have our resources. My guess is that this sentiment is shared by many of our parishioners. I would point out that we have these resources because we try very hard to be careful, not shortsighted, with spending. We have this abundance because of your giving of time, talent, and treasure.

But every parish councilor and most parishioners are fully aware of our dependence on having a successful festival. We saw during the height of the pandemic what the loss of a full festival cost us. It does not take much for the strength of the balance sheet to be eroded. Just a thought to keep in mind.

I believe that this year's festival will be very challenging. We are doing what we can to manage costs, and so far, things are not bad. But final costs are not in and the "transitory inflation" that Washington bureaucrats and politicians talked about in February has already been consigned to the dustbin of history.

When the festival is done and the accounts are settled, we will see the impact the turmoil in the world has had on our results. With hard work, lots of volunteers, good weather, and customers who are looking forward to our special event, we can do well. And I am confident we will. Oh, do not forget that "St Sophia's Needs You".

THE MASSACRE OF CHIOS PART 2

The author and classicist Christopher Plato Castanis (1814-1866) in his autobiography “The Greek Exile” described his eyewitness account of the massacre. “On Good Friday morning at sunrise the Turks landed and prepared their work of devastation. My mother and I leaped from the window to go to the English Consulate. I fell and hit my head ad fainted. A rifle ball whistled near my ear. I arose with a shriek. Before me stood a Turk holding the head of one of our neighbors. The blood dripped on me and the Turk said ‘Fear not you are mine.’” Castanis was sold into slavery, forced to practice Islam and attend Turkish schools. One night after administering opium to his master, Castanis escaped and reunited with his mother. They fled to Nafplion where he met Dr. Samuel Gridley Howe who sponsored his voyage to America. Castanis became an academic in Boston. He embarked on a lecture series called “As a living monument of Turkish cruelty and American philanthropy”.

The massacre of Chios shocked the world. One London Times article on July 6, 1822 described it as “one continuous scene of murder, conflagration and plunder both in country and town. All women were sent to slavery and the men and children above the age of 12 were massacred”. The massacre became a symbol of unjust oppression. Poems were written about this including “The Fall of Scio” in October 1822, “The voice of Scio” 1823 and “The Sisters of Scio” 1829. Other artistic depictions such as Delacroix’s famous oil on canvas titled “The Massacre of Chios”, Thomas Barber’s fresco “Massacre of Sciotes” 1825 and Robert Forrest’s statue “The Sisters of Scio” 1839. These works and additional publications emphasized a barbaric view of the Ottoman Empire.

Famous American politicians, statesmen and philhellenes Daniel Webster (1782-1852) and Henry Clay (1777-1852) expressed their outrage of the Chios massacre garnering pro-Hellenic sentiment throughout the United States. In Europe the artist Delacroix and the poet and great philhellene Lord Byron did the same. The destruction of Chios was a pivotal event opening the eyes of the world to the deplorable acts of the Ottoman Empire and encouraging support for the Greek revolution.

THE GREEK IMIGRANT AND AHEPA HISTORY PART 5

Continued from the April NEPSIS

The war of 1914 brought all the forces of Xenophobia together and cast, over them, the aura of patriotic necessity. It was the years when every citizen faced a running demand for proof of his “100 per cent Americanism”. It was not safe to champion the cause of the foreign-born.

In 1917, over President Wilson’s veto, the literacy test for immigration was passed and enacted into law. The sponsors of this law were not only interested in selecting the more intelligent and rejecting the less intelligent, but were more interested in a means of barring the southern and eastern Europeans without excluding those from the northern and Western parts of the Europeans continent.

The Act of 1925 and 1924 set up quotas as to the volume of immigration as to how many would be admitted from each country. There were years where the number of immigrants departing the United States exceeded the number of admissions. My grandfather/papou was one of them and his name is on the log of Ellis Island. After his experience of one year discrimination, he returned to Greece to his birth place of Kefalonia.

In the 1920’s, Klan membership (KKK) exceeded 4 million people nationwide. It was time for the Greek immigrant to band together in order to provide better quality of life and safety for himself and his family. In 1922, the first chapter of the AHEPA rose to the occasion to aid the Greek/Hellenic immigrant by supporting the immigrant and elevate him to be able to compete and enjoy the American Dream.

Now Hellenism had two pillars, the Greek Orthodox Church and the AHEPA.


